6. All exhibits to be staged between 8.30-10.30am on show day at Bournehead, Meshaw EX36 4NJ.
7. Judging will start at 10.30am, all exhibitors are required to have left the field at this time.

LEMON DRIZZLE CAKE IN LOAF TIN RECIPE

Cake:

175g unsalted butter softened

175g caster sugar

3 large eggs

Zest of 2 unwaxed lemons

175g self raising flour

1 tsp baking powder

2 tbsp milk

Drizzle:

100g granulated sugar

Juice of 2 lemons

Any items being donated to the tea tent should be provided with a full list of ingredients.
